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A. Manuscript Submission Criteria Guidelines:

- 1. The manuscript is a result of management and business research. The manuscript should have a novelty/authenticity contribution or uniqueness for academic (science) development.
- 2. The manuscript contains original research work, free from plagiarism and other unethical attitudes.
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B. Submission of Manuscript

Manuscripts for submission should be complete in all respects, original in content, and have not previously been published or being considered for publication elsewhere. All manuscripts must be written in English, complete with tables and/or figures, and should be submitted to the ILOMATA ILOMATA INTERNATIONAL JOURNAL OF TAX AND ACCOUNTING manuscript submission website. Articles should be between 6000 and 10000 words in length. This includes all text including references and appendices. The preferred format is a Microsoft Word (Windows) document. If accepted, the manuscript must not be published elsewhere in the same form, either in English or another language, without the consent of the Editor and Publisher. Upon acceptance of an article, authors will be asked to complete a Journal Publishing Agreement (JPA).

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Manuscripts must be on A4 paper, with margins of 2.5 cm on all four sides, the font should be 12-point Garamond and 1.15 spaced. Manuscripts should be ordered as follows:

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- 2. Page 2 should contain the 'Abstract' approximately 250 words. The abstract should be structured and include the objective, methods, results, and conclusions. The abstract should be followed by 5 to 7 keywords.
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Each illustration should be numbered consecutively using Arabic numbers and accompanied by a legend describing it. All illustrations must be submitted in a format suitable for reproduction across either a single column or an entire page. Each table should be clearly titled and labeled with a

I. Proofs

Proofs will be sent to the authors by e-mail. Only minor changes are allowed and printer's errors must be corrected; no change or additions to the edited manuscript will be allowed at this stage. The corrected proofs must be returned within 2 (two) days of receipt, preferably by e-mail. If the editor receives no reply after 1 (one) week, they will assume that there are no errors to correct and the article will be published after in-house revision.
